Call to Order

NC 507 CoC Meeting Ground Rules

This is a public discussion, not a debate. The purpose is *not* to win an argument, but to hear many points of view and explore many options and solutions.

Everyone is encouraged to participate. You may be asked to share what you think, or we may ask for comments from those who haven't spoken. It is always OK to "pass" when you are asked to share a comment.

No one or two individuals should dominate a discussion. If you have already voiced your ideas, let others have an opportunity. When you speak, be brief and to the point.

When you speak, state your name and where you live. In a public meeting, it is helpful to know who is speaking as well as where they live in the community.

One person speaks at a time. Refrain from side conversations. Pay attention to the person speaking. If you think you will forget an idea that comes to mind, write it down.

Listen to and respect other points of view.

Do your best to understand the pros and cons of every option, not just those you prefer. Be as objective and fair-minded as you can be.

Seek first to understand, not to be understood. Ask questions to seek clarification when you don't understand the meaning of someone's comments. Respect facilitator / Stick to agenda: Most of our meetings are time sensitive. We do recognize that at times a topic or issue may arise that requires further discussion. Allow for that topic to be added at the end of the agenda or allow staff to schedule a meeting to address the issue specifically.







- The Funding Review Committee reviewed and scored the bonus NOFO applications last week and sent our recommendation to the CoC Board which unanimously approved the committee's rankings of applicants.
- The committee will be reviewing SNOFO proposals this week. (5 organizations)
- SNOFO applicant interviews will be held the week of Sept 26. The committee is splitting into two groups so that each group will be interviewing half of the applicants.
- The committee will be meeting on Oct 30th to make our recommendations regarding the rankings of the proposals to the CoC board.
- We will be requiring two e-votes for the SNOFO: Sept 28 (Strategic Plan Narrative and Oct 5, Priority Funding listing. We will need responses within 24 hours from all Governing Board members.

- There was a discussion surrounding difficulties in engaging people into services due to active mental health concerns or substance use
- Workgroup is working to identify a workgroup committee chair.
 - There are currently about 145 unsheltered individuals enrolled in Street Outreach.
