### NC 507 Meeting "Ground Rules"



**This is a public discussion, not a debate**. The purpose is *not* to win an argument, but to hear many points of view and explore many options and solutions.

**Everyone is encouraged to participate.** You may be asked to share what you think, or we may ask for comments from those who haven't spoken. It is always OK to "pass" when you are asked to share a comment.

**No one or two individuals should dominate a discussion**. If you have already voiced your ideas, let others have an opportunity. When you speak, be brief and to the point.

When you speak, state your name and your org if appropriate. In a public meeting, it is helpful to know who is speaking as well as where they live in the community.

One person speaks at a time. Refrain from side conversations. Pay attention to the person speaking. If you think you will forget an idea that comes to mind, write it down.

Listen to and respect other points of view.

**Do your best to understand the pros and cons of every option**, not just those you prefer. Be as objective and fair-minded as you can be.

**Seek first to understand, not to be understood**. Ask questions to seek clarification when you don't understand the meaning of someone's comments.

**Respect facilitator / Stick to agenda:** Most of our meetings are time sensitive. We do recognize that at times a topic or issue may arise that requires further discussion. Allow for that topic to be added at the end of the agenda or allow staff to schedule a meeting to address the issue specifically.



    - 1. HMIS Audit and Action Plan: Audit of all project, service, and assessment set up for each agency. Complete discussion, plan and timeline for finalizing all settings and workflows.
      - 1. 12/7- Template for Audit reviewed; sent to Governance Board for approval
      - 2. 1/1- 2/24- Implementation begins.
      - 3. 3/1- Complete Audits Reviewed by DAC
    - 2. HMIS Privacy Policy applicable to Clarity
      - 1. 12/7- DAC Review; send to Governance Board for Approval
    - 3. Training: Learning Management Software, User Guides, Short- Structured Video training, live trainings at least once a month
      - 1. Awaiting additional information
      - 2. 12/7 Additional discussion and planning at DAC meeting



## Data Advisory Committee

#### **Additional Priorities:**

#### HIGH Priorities:

- System Administrator facilitation of community discussion and decision making to establish CE,
   Referral, and Community Queue Settings
- A written Data Quality Plan that sets expectations for data collection is critical to improved local and federal reporting.
- Unclear expectations regarding response times, protocols for complex requests, and feedback for technical support improvement.
- Reporting Deadlines specific to agency and project responsibilities is a high priority.

#### OCTOBER 2022

- Weekly meetings on Thursdays at 1pm
- General focus currently on winter WF Shelter
  - Two working options that will be finalized this week
    - Option 1 (multi-site operation) in collaboration with faith communities
    - Option 2 (single site operation) facility that has been presented as possible option
- Hurricane Ian Response
  - Activated emergency shelter
  - 100 individuals at primary shelter
  - 6 people at family shelter



# CoC – HERC (Homeless Emergency Response Committee

#### November 2022

- Meeting every other Thursday at 1pm
- We have a single site for WF Emergency Shelter
  - Should be operational on or before December 1st.
  - Back up sites at Pullen Memorial Baptist and Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Raleigh.
  - Families with Children will utilize Salvation Army.
- Focus will resume to our community's response plan to inclement weather, natural disasters, or other mass displacement scenarios.
- White Flag Declarations twice a week.
  - White Flag was declared Nov 13, 2022

### Street Outreach


- Currently 154 active households enrolled in Street Outreach.
  - This includes 60 Chronic homeless and 94 Non-Chronic
  - Also, 11 families, and 143 singles

Street Outreach teams are currently engaging with 8 different encampments, as well as working with RDU airport.

Paige with TFS did have a meeting with GoTriangle about the concerns surrounding the busses and unsheltered persons.




## Street Outreach Demographics






## EHV Demographics



#### Demographics of the By Name List

- 54% Female; 42% Male
- 50% Black, African American; 27% White; >1% Asian/South Pacific; 1% Native American/Indigenous, 5% Multi-racial, 14% Unknown
- Average Age is 41
- 66 Households with Children; 235 Single or Adult Only Households
- Longest on the list is 790 days; Top 50 Average of days enrolled 121 days
