Coordinated Access System Committee Governance

Roles & Responsibilities

- Ensuring fair and equitable distribution of services and resources.
- Regularly reviewing and overseeing the prioritization process.
- Ensuring consumers, providers, and key stakeholders are involved with the prioritization process.
- Ensuring homelessness service providers receive ongoing training and learning opportunities.
- Recommend changes/modifications to the CAS Written Standards and the policies and procedures.
- Ensuring feedback loops are created for consumers and homeless system providers. Feedback should be presented to the CoC Governance Board.
- Provide oversight of the CoC's CAS Lead to ensure compliance with HUD reporting, standards, and expectations.



Current By-Name List Prioritization

- 1) Disability
- 2) Cumulative length of time homeless in a shelter or street outreach
- 3) Chronicity
 - HUD Definition: Has been homeless and living as described for at least 12 months or on at least 4 separate occasions in the last 3 years, as long as the combined occasions equal at least 12 months and each break in homelessness separating the occasions included at least 7 consecutive nights of not living as described.
- 4) Other programs client is enrolled in
 - The more programs enrolled, higher on the list of prioritization
- 5) VISPDAT

By-Name List Prioritization

<u>Information from Stephen Gruver</u>

- Consider prioritizing pregnant women in their 3rd trimester for shelter or housing.
 - This was presented to Stephen Gruver from Brian Klausner of WakeMed
 - They have seen patients come into the hospital, in their 3rd trimester and they and their family are stay on a hotel
 - Have been through Coordinated Entry but on the waitlist for shelter



By-Name List Prioritization Timeline

Information found via the NC Balance of State

Order of Priority: Updated to reflect the new order of priority for ESG and/or CoC-funded permanent housing.

- 1) Most severe service needs, as determined through HART acuity score.
- Highest HART acuity score <u>and</u> experiencing unsheltered homelessness.
- 3) Highest HART acuity score and the longest length of time homeless.
- 4) Highest HART acuity score and disabling condition.
- 5) Family with highest HART acuity score.



CE Assessment Tool Timeline

Information found via the NC Balance of State

- 1) Revision with Stakeholders
- 2) Pilot Phase
- 3) Analysis and Revision with Community
 - Points & weighing was applied after the analysis
- 4) Training Phase
- 5) Launch Phase

They basically gave each phase two months



NC Balance of State created a new assessment to replace the VI-SPDAT, the HART

Homeless Assessment & Referral Tool (HART)

- 1) Housing and Homeless History (Weighted 4.2)
 - 1) How long has it been since you lived in your own place?
 - 2) How many months have you been without a home, such as living outside or in a shelter?
 - 3) Where did you sleep last night?
 - 4) Where will you sleep tonight?
- 2) Risk (Weight 1)
 - 1) Did you leave your previous or current living situation because you felt unsafe?
 - 2) Have you experienced violence since becoming homeless?
 - 3) Have you ever experienced violence with someone close to you?
 - 4) Are you currently experiencing or feel you are at risk of experiencing violence?



Homeless Assessment & Referral Tool (HART)

1) Health & Wellness (Weighted 3.25)

- 1) Does anyone in your household have any physical or mental health conditions that are treated or have been treated by a professional?
- 2) Do you have lung cancer, kidney or liver failure, heart disease, or a substance use disorder?
- 3) Is the lack of housing making it hard to get to a doctor's office or take prescribed medications?
- 4) Do you have health insurance?


2) Family Unit (Weighted 3)

- 1) What is the date of birth of all family members?
- 2) Is anyone in the household pregnant?
- 3) How many <u>children</u> under the age of 18 are not currently staying with your family, but would live with you? (if you have a home)
- 4) How many <u>adults</u> 18 or older are not currently staying with your family, but would live with you? (if you had a home)

Next Steps:

Prioritization:

- Continue to look at ways Street Outreach and Shelter may not inhibit getting services to clients that refuse shelter or do not qualify for SO
- Potential prioritization of those that are "Medically Fragile" (i.e. 3rd trimester, Receiving Chemo, Receiving Dialysis,

Assessment:

- Look over the HART Assessment questions and adapt them to better fit our community
- Potentially add more sections to gain more specific information pertaining to barriers and demographics
