# Defining Role of Access Sites

- **Context:**
  - Goal 1, specifically Objectives 1 and 3 focus on CE access and enrollment.
  - CoC receiving requests from new agencies/program staff to participate in CE.
  - Lead Agency is not yet staffed to support quality training for new agencies.
- **Discussion:**
  - Interim approach while in transition of HMIS and CE tool
  - Ideal state or long-term planning

# Defining Role of Access Sites

- **Key Questions:**

- Difference between “Access Site”, “CE Participating Provider”, “CE Housing Provider”?
  - Can be both! Need to identify/clarify where this happens.
  - Access Site: “at minimum”
    - Screening: Diversion, emphasis on Prevention
    - Completing CE screening, enrollment, initial referrals
    - Emergency services – DV, regional CoCs, etc.
  - May be difficult to do the VI-SPDAT/tool because of intensity of questions and need for addtl rapport with clients and potentially need for ongoing engagement
  - Participating Provider
    - VI/Assessment
    - CE enrollments?
- Who/How/When are VI-SPDATs conducted currently?
  - Only VIs OCC is completing is with Street Outreach clients. Care Coord. want to be able to do that but don’t observe long enough to complete it.
  - WCWC CMs will do VI-SPDAT but varies as to when, not during intake though!
- How do we define and track “active” period for households on the BNL?
- Expanding/Potential Access Sites:
  - All Wake County regional centers!!
  - Western Wake – Dorcas!
  - Healthcare – NeighborHealth, others?

<b>Orange County</b>	<i>Same status as Wake – exploring replacement options;</i>
